Barclay Square Red Cliffs Conservation Guidelines

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For the Rural City of Mildura

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Introduction.

Barclay Square Red Cliffs, was first identified as having heritage value in the 1988 Mildura Heritage Study: Andrew C Ward & Associates architects - planners, *City and Shire of Mildura Conservation Study,* for the City and Shire of Mildura, June 1988. The square was subsequently included in the Mildura Planning Scheme, Heritage Overlay as HO303.

This report has prepared a detailed inventory of each of the buildings which contribute to the character and significance of the Square. The objective of the study has been to provide details on the fabric of each building as a guide to the future conservation, maintenance and development of the precinct. This includes maintenance, repairs, alterations and additions and possible infill buildings.

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History of Red Cliffs.

The town of Mildura on the Murray River, was developed as an irrigation colony in 1898 by the Chaffey brothers. The first extension to the colony was in 1912 with the development of the Merbein Scheme to the west. The third development was at Red Cliffs. It was developed after World War One for approximately 700 returned soldiers as part of a wider Soldier Settlement Scheme across the State. The 33,000 acres of the settlement were subdivided into blocks of approximately fifteen acres each for the production of dried fruit. In 1920 the contract for clearing the land was given to Frank Bottrill who used the tractor "Big Lizzie" for this purpose. By 1940, 12,000 acres of vines and citrus fruits were being irrigated.

History of Barclay Square.

The township was sited adjacent to the Ballarat - Mildura Railway which was operational by 1903. The centre of the town is a grid of wide streets focusing on the new railway station opposite which a public garden was planned. The defining north - south streets, Jacaranda and Ilex were named after trees. The two east west streets, Indi and Jalmieson after rivers. Land was auctioned in 1920, and by December 1920 all of the blocks facing the public gardens in Indi and Jamieson Ave. were sold. The four corner blocks of the gardens were reserved for later 'civic' development of post office, bank and offices. Three of these remain. the fourth corner was developed with the installation of big Lizzie in 1970. In 1922 the Diggerland theatre was completed, the building of the water tower in 1924, and and the post office in 1928 completed the square. It was named after Councillor Barclay.

Description of Building types

The commercial centre of Red Cliffs has two building types; 'single storey shops' and two storey buildings and free standing buildings identified in this document as 'major items'

Single storey shops were quickly built featuring distinctive tall parapets and post supported timber verandahs over the footpaths in the 1920s, later shops built in the 1930s have cantilevered awnings. They were built to the east side of Ilex St. and the north side of Jamieson St. Each of the buildings are of brick or reinforced concrete construction. The architectural style is described as "Between the Wars" or "Stripped Classicism". The single storey development is contrasted with free standing stand alone buildings of one and two storeys around the square (major items). This urban design scheme is shown on drawing below. All the buildings are serviced by lanes to the rear of the major streets.

Over time the post supported verandahs were removed, particularly in the 1950s when there was an Australia wide movement to remove the verandahs due to concerns with possible safety issues with the growth of the use of cars. The shops were replaced with cantilevered awnings often with pressed metal ceilings. Original shop fronts were constructed with small section metal frames, tiles were installed beneath windows and on party walls. Leadlight or coloured glass windows were installed above door head. Originally most buildings were probably not painted but a pallette of painted creams and buffs has evolved. Only one remains intact, at 25 Ilex St. Signs were a distinctive feature of the shops. A great variety of sign types and sizes featured prominently on parapets, verandah awnings and sun blinds.

The rear of the shops have service yards, accessed off lanes. Most properties have utilised these spaces for additions, mechanical equipment and parking. The rear of the properties were originally constructed of red face brick and corrugated iron.

Distinctive two storey buildings compliment the low line of the shops in both Indi Jamieson streets. They have been described as 'major items', such as the Diggerland Theatre and the former banks. Included in this category are the single storey buildings sited in the corners of the gardens such as the Post Office. None of these buildings had signs and the main conservation measure needed for these buildings is to maintain and paint them them in appropriate colours.

Significance of Barclay Square

The heritage significance of Barclay Square has been assessed using Heritage Victoria's criteria that are considered apply to the square.

Criteria A: Importance to the course or pattern, of Victoria's cultural history. The Square, as the business centre for Red Cliffs is an important component of the development of the North West of Victoria as an agricultural area.

Criteria B: Possession of uncommon, rare or endangered aspects of Victoria's cultural history.

The Square, comprising public garden and surrounding commercial and civic buildings is a rare early example of a planned urban space.

Criteria E: Importance in exhibiting particular aesthetic characteristics.

The Square is considered important in demonstrating aesthetic characteristics of a planned built form of commercial buildings integrated with a public park with mature trees.

Criteria F: Importance in demonstrating a high degree of creative or technical achievement at a particular period

The buildings and water tower demonstrate early examples of the use of reinforced concrete in Victoria.

Criteria G: Strong or special association with a particular community or cultural group for social, cultural or spiritual reasons. This includes the significance of a place ti indigenous peopleas as part of their continuing and developing cultural traditions.

The Square is considered important as a community and social gathering space for the 1921 Red Cliffs Soldier Settlement Scheme.

Barclay Square is of heritage significance as a designed and planned public open space and focus for the Red Cliffs township. It has aesthetic significance with consistent architecture of its commercial buildings, most dating from the 1920s. It has historic significance relating to its association with the Soldier Settlement of Red Cliffs.

Conservation Guidelines

To conserve the significance of the precinct an inventory of all the buildings in the Barclay Square Heritage Overlay has been made, which identifies buildings by street number and either current or former use. Guidelines have been suggested which recommend for the single storey shops:

- removal of out of character signs on parapets.
- removal of oversized screens to awning fascias.
- · recoomendations for placement of new signs.
- restoration of shopfronts including removal of paint off tiles and windows.
- preservation of intact shopfronts and parapets where applicable
- retention of face red brick to rear and sides of buildings.

Key architectural contributory buildings, 'major elements' generally include overall painting only. The recommended paint schemes encourage creams and buffs, highlighted withe either dark reds or cream
