The Recharge scheme was developed in Nillumbik Shire Council, Victoria, as a response to the needs identified in their community. It has now been extended right across Victoria.

The Recharge scheme identifies local businesses who provide access to a power point for people who utilise motorised scooters, gophers & electric wheelchairs.

Power points are made available so that people can recharge the battery of their scooter, gopher or electric wheelchair when it is necessary. It is aimed at giving people confidence to get to and from their destination—knowing support is available if they require it.

Recharge stickers are visible on participating shop fronts so the affiliated businesses can be easily identified. Recharge stickers are also placed above or near allocated power points so people can quickly ascertain which power point has been set aside from them to utilise.

Do you want to become a project partner?

There are a number of requirements for a local business to become a participant in this project. These are that you are physically accessible and able to provide an accessible power point.

The cost of electricity to recharge an electric scooter or wheelchair for up to an hour is only 10-20 cents. For such a small cost, businesses can make a big difference in the lives of people who utilise a mobility device.
