Gerard José our new CEO

New Council CEO Gerard José is looking forward to moving to Mildura and getting to know locals when he commences in the role this spring.

Mr José, his wife Michelle and two teenage daughters will relocate to Mildura from Greater Taree City Council in NSW where he has been CEO for the past seven years.

Having also worked at Knox City Council, the Shire of Campaspe, the Municipal Association of Victoria, City of Nunawading, Ringwood City Council and the City of Heidelberg, Mr José has extensive local government experience and is excited about the opportunities and challenges facing Mildura Rural City Council. As Chief Executive Officer, his role is to oversee the day-to-day operations of the organisation.

Mr José will start work at Mildura Rural City Council on Monday 6 October 2014.

Safer All Round

Safety has been improved at the intersection of Benetook Avenue and Sixteenth Street, with the new roundabout now open to traffic.

The roundabout has been constructed to cater not only for passenger vehicles, but also for heavy vehicles including A-Double trucks. The design will ensure clearer sight lines for vehicles approaching and navigating the intersection, which means there should be less reason for risky manoeuvres by drivers.

The Federal Government contributed \$656,000 to the project through their Black Spot program with Council chipping in an additional \$509,000.

Under the Black Spot program, Councils can apply for funding to repair and improve sections of road where serious accidents have repeatedly occurred.

Council has also received Federal Government funding to construct a roundabout at the intersection of San Mateo Avenue and Sixteenth Street and will hopefully kick off this project early in 2015.

Ouyen's new lake on the way


Ouyen is set to get its very own recreational lake.

An old reservoir on the north western edge of the town will be transformed in to a lake for swimming, boating, skiing and fishing. The new lake will adjoin the nearby golf and tennis clubs, providing important social, economic and environmental benefits for the Mallee Track community.

Stage 1 of the project is estimated to cost \$1.9 million, which will include construction of the lake itself, along with surrounding infrastructure, pipelines and filling the lake.

Work on constructing the new lake is expected to commence in 2015 and it is hoped it will be ready for use by 2016.

Council has worked closely with the Ouyen community to help secure funding towards the project and in July the State Government committed \$500,000 through its Putting Locals First Program. On top of the \$500,000 from the state government, Top End Training have committed \$500,000 in-kind support, Ouyen Inc. has contributed \$200,000 cash/in-kind support and GWM Water are contributing \$746,000.





\$1 million upgrade for Irymple drains

More than 700 metres of concrete pipes are being installed beneath the roads and laneways in Irymple.

Ranging from 900mm to 1200mm in diameter, the pipes will significantly increase the capacity of Irymple's drainage infrastructure. Once completed, the new system will help reduced the chances of flash flooding throughout the Irymple catchment area.

Contractors are digging 3 metre deep trenches to accommodate the pipes which will run between the intersection of Koorlong Avenue, along McGowen Lane, Hassell Street and Elms Street to the Teleki Drive Drainage Basin (Wilkie Drive Drainage basin).

Work on the \$1 million project started in July and it is likely to be completed by the end of October, subject to weather.

Motorists are reminded to take care when driving in the Irymple area and that parking and access to all nearby businesses is still available.

Riverfront water play area takes shape

Recent visitors to the Mildura riverfront may have spotted considerable activity along Hugh King Drive. Major earthworks and excavation is underway at the site of the Ornamental Lake, where a new water play area is being constructed.

Contractors have been working in the area since mid-July to remodel and extend the existing lake to incorporate safe water play elements. Plans include a shallow body of water with channels and weirs to reflect our irrigation history dotted with water play equipment, pop-up water jets and rocky shallows.

There will also be a new BBQ area, boardwalks, sand play zone, decking, seats, lighting, timber shade pergolas and new plantings including trees to enhance the space further over the coming years

The Mildura skate park will also be enhanced as part of this works package. A new terraced skate spot will be constructed, with a series of graduating ramps, perfect for skating, scooting or riding on, to extend down from the existing skate park and link it with the rest of the riverfront precinct.

These works are part of the \$18.3 million project Council is undertaking to reinvigorate Mildura's riverfront precinct. This project has already seen new public amenities constructed at Nowingi Place, along with upgrades to existing amenities, new BBQ facilities, pathways and landscaping around the area.

Later this year, work will start on all other elements of the riverfront redevelopment project, which include construction of a shared promenade-style footpath linking all zones within the precinct, redevelopments to the Mildura Rowing Club and the all-important pedestrian connection from Langtree Avenue which will link Mildura's CBD to the river via a street-level path across the railway line.

The Mildura Riverfront Precinct Redevelopment project is jointly funded by the Victorian State Government, Federal Government and Mildura Rural City Council.

Today there are more than 35 registered Family Day Care educators across the Mildura region including the Wentworth Shire Council area. Educators provide a safe, secure, caring and stimulating environment for young babies through to pre-teens.

Over the past 35 years hundreds of people have opened their homes and cared for thousands of babies and children.

To celebrate this wonderful milestone a special Family Day Care 35th birthday celebration will be held from 9:30am to 11:30am on Thursday 23 October in the Benetook Room at the Alfred Deakin Centre, on the corner of Deakin Avenue and Twelfth Street Mildura.

Past, present and prospective Family Day Care educators and families are invited to join in the fun. There will be balloons, free face painting, craft activities and story time for the children as well as historical displays and information about Family Day Care.

Hybrid excavator turning heads at Mildura Landfill

At Council we have over 430 different types of vehicles, plant and equipment, and staff work hard to keep them all in tip top working condition.

When we purchase new items of equipment, Council looks at a range of attributes including how environmentally friendly the items are. And with our environmental sustainability in mind, Council has just invested in our first hybrid heavy vehicle.

The Komatsu Hybrid Excavator is now operating at the Mildura Landfill and is proving to be just as powerful as the diesel fuel members of the fleet.

Depending on the type of work it is doing, on average the new hybrid excavator uses anywhere from 25% to 40% less fuel then a standard excavator. The electric swing motor also generates its own electricity and this leads to a significant reduction in CO2 emissions.

In addition to the hybrid excavator, Council also has eight hybrid passenger vehicles in our fleet of cars. This is another example of the how Council is working to reduce our environmental footprint and reduce our energy costs overall.

To manage traffic flow and avoid queues on the day people are asked to register if they intend to use the Detox your Home service. You can register online or over the phone, then just turn up on the day with your unwanted items, and the trained Detox your Home team will do the rest.


