













New playground design for Red Cliffs Early Years Hub

As works progress on the new Red Cliffs Early Years Hub, excitement is building following the unveiling of detailed designs for the site's new playground.

The new playground will include:

- A nest swing and early childhood swing
- Mound tunnel and slide
- Mud kitchen
- Climbing frame
- Bitumen riding track
- Circular bench seat

Existing equipment will also be refurbished, providing an outstanding experience for kinder students and the public.

The Red Cliffs Early Years Hub is being delivered by local builders CPM Building Contractors, thanks to a \$6million grant from the Victorian School Building Authority's Building Blocks program.

The project involves constructing new kindergarten and Maternal Child Health buildings on the corner of Indi Avenue and Guava Street with a modern facility.

Other features include:

- Four kindergarten rooms
- Two Maternal and Child Health (MCH) and allied health consulting rooms
- Toy Library facilities
- Multi-use community space
- Breastfeeding room
- Large foyer area

The Hub is expected to be completed by the start of Term 2, 2025. For more information visit mildura.vic.gov.au/RCEYH

for our newest citizens

Mildura's cultural diversity was further enriched as 30 new Australian citizens were welcomed at a joyous ceremony at Powerhouse Place last month.

Council's Multicultural Liaison Officer Zia Ibrahimi, a refugee from Afghanistan who received his Australian citizenship in 2010, said the occasion marked both the end of a long journey and the start of an exciting new one.

"For some it could be up to 16 years waiting for their citizenship, so personally, when you become an Australian citizen it means everything," Zia said.

"Australia has more than 300 different cultures living in harmony and that is a very powerful thing. In my case being a refugee you don't have a country of origin to go back to, so becoming an Australian citizen gives you an identity that you had lost, almost a second chance of being who you want to be."

The ceremony, which featured a Traditional Smoking Ceremony, welcomed our newest citizens from 16 countries including Iraq, Syrian Arab Republic, South Africa, Rwanda, Bangladesh, New Zealand, United Kingdom, China, Phillipines, Vietnam, Afghanistan, Samoa, Serbia, India and Tibet.

In 2024, we've welcomed 168 new citizens over six ceremonies in Mildura.

"Life in Mildura is easy compared to the big cities or some of the situations these people may have left in their own countries. It's a wonderful place to call home," Zia said.

The next Citizenship Ceremony will be at Powerhouse Place on Friday 24 January.

Is it time for your child's MCH visit?

If you have a baby or child under school age, it is important to take them to regular visits with one of our Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Nurses.

Free visits are recommended at 10 key milestones from birth to school age. At each visit, the MCH Nurse will check your child's health, growth and development.

They can also support you on your parenting journey and provide information about sleep and settling, feeding and starting solids, immunisations, family wellbeing and starting kindergarten and school.

You don't have to wait until your child's next visit to contact a MCH Nurse. If you have concerns, please call us to arrange a booking.

Early Years boost for Nichols Point

Nichols Point will be home to a modern four-room, 132-place Integrated Early Years Centre.

The new centre will be established on the old Nichols Point Primary School site and include two consultation rooms, a community meeting room and community activity space, all housed within the existing old primary school building, which will be updated.

The Nichols Point Integrated Early Years Centre will not only provide a muchneeded boost to kindergarten places in the community, but provide a smoother transition from kinder to primary school for local families.

The new Centre has been made possible following Mildura Rural City Council's successful application for \$8.95million in Victorian Government funding through the Building Blocks Capacity Grant program.

A new building will also be established at the site, adjacent to the existing school building, which will include:

- four kindergarten rooms with capacity for 132 kindergarten places
- parent lounge
- breastfeeding room
- staff amenities
- consultation room.

Mildura's Langtree Mall is enjoying a fresh, new look following the completion of four placemaking projects.

Adding a new spark to the popular retail precinct, the initiatives were completed with support from the Victorian Government and Mildura City Heart as part of Council's CBD Revitalisation Project.

The initiatives focus on four placemaking principles identified in the strategy:

- **Relax on the Lawn** Creating a grassed area for patrons to enjoy near the existing stage
- Seasonal Displays of Green planter boxes featuring more plants, trees and shade

- **Space Under Lights** artistic structures that feature reactive lighting improving safety and access
- 'Tropicator' Mall Misters unique misters that will help provide some relief in the hot weather, while creating a bit of fun for visitors.

A fifth placemaking initiative – Music and PA – is also in development and will be delivered in 2025.

Now complete, the initiatives will further enhance the City Heart's ability to host events, activate the space, and better connect people to Feast Street, the wider CBD Precinct, the Riverfront, and the impending Trail of Lights exhibition – which will commence in mid-2025 at Lock 11 Island.

Kerbside glass collection exceeds 100 tonnes!

Residents are being praised for how well they have embraced their fourth, kerbside bin specifically for glass recycling, with an incredible 106.7 tonnes collected in the first three months!

The new service was introduced in July 2024 to comply with State Government legislation, taking eligible glass out of the comingled recycling stream into its own service.

Glass jars and bottles are currently accepted through the service, with all glass collected being transformed into new and useful materials, including road base material for future local projects.

More than 69% of kerbside waste collected by Mildura Rural City Council is now recycled or reused, contributing to a more circular waste system for our region.

This includes 703.3 tonnes of comingled recycling and 2,559.8 tonnes of food and organics collected during the 2024/25 financial year so far.
