

Mildura Bilingual Storybook Project

The region's rich, multicultural roots are being celebrated through a new series of childrens storybooks.

Eleven storybooks have been created in English, Arabic, Punjabi, Dari, Kirundi, Filipino and Uyghur and other languages through the Mildura Bilingual Storybook Project – a joint partnership between Mildura Rural City Council, SuniTAFE and other community groups.

The books have been written, illustrated and translated by community volunteers following a series of writing and illustration workshops held throughout 2023.

The books, which were launched at a special celebration at the Mildura Arts Centre, are available for download from Council's website.

Audio versions of the books are also available, while limited hard copies have been made available to local schools and other organisations.

Green light for Final stage of Deakin Avenue redevelopment





Work will soon start on the third and final stage of the biggest upgrade to our iconic Deakin Avenue centre median in the city's history!

Mildura Rural City Councillors have endorsed final plans for the redevelopment of the centre median between Seventh and Eighth Streets, which will follow a similar theme to the completed stages between Eighth and Tenth Streets, including:

- replacing the previously removed sugar gums
- > a new central footpath
- more than 1,600 new plantings, introducing more colour to the centre median
- feature lighting to highlight various aspects of the new landscape
- grassed areas, mature plants and landscaped features
- updated street furniture
- refurbishment of the existing historic limestone structure
- replacement of the existing public toilet facility
- > refurbishment of the water fountain

The majority of the \$1.9 million redevelopment has been funded through \$1.2 million from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program and is expected to be completed in August this year.

DON'T FORGET TO REGISTER YOUR PET! Pet owners have until 10 April 2024 to register their animals with Mildura Rural City Council.

All cats and dogs over three months of age must be microchipped and registered. This helps ensure lost animals can be reunited with their owners if found by Council staff or returned to the Mildura Pound.

Residents with access to kerbside recycling and rubbish collection can expect to receive their new 120L purple-lidded glass recycling bin in April 2024, ahead of the service's commencement date from 1 July.

The introduction of the new glass-only recycling service is a mandatory requirement under state government legislation, and will ensure more items are being reused for other purposes.

Mildura Rural City Council will deliver the new bins to eligible households in April 2024, along with an information pack containing a free A-Z guide that will help residents sort their waste from July 2024.

Once introduced, the new 120L glass bin will be emptied once a month.

Additional details on utilising the new purple bin for glass recycling will be provided upon bin arrival in April 2024. Until then, households are requested to maintain their usual three-bin system.


Cool Change for our Playgrounds

Exhibition at Mildura Arts Centre

Visit Collective Movements at Mildura Arts Centre and discover artworks that recognise collectivity as integral to Indigenous knowledge and ways of being. Open until Sunday 28 April 2024.

Collective Movements: First Nations Collectives, Collaborations and Creative Practices from across Victoria is a wide-ranging project focusing on the work of historic and contemporary First Nations creative practitioners and community groups from across Victoria that recognises collectivity as integral to Indigenous knowledges and ways of being. An exhibition, publishing project, conversation and workshop platform, the project begins with the desire to make more visible a language and terminology beyond Western art concepts of 'collaboration' and 'collectivism'— one that better describes and acknowledges the way Indigenous creatives work within a broader community and its inheritances.
